

Arts Leadership Certificate Program - Requirements

The ALP Certificate is a 2-year program. To graduate, accepted students must complete the following requirements in that time frame.

COURSE & INTERNSHIPS: 6 credits minimum

- Complete 4 credits of ALC courses + 2 credits for internships
- Take a minimum of 3 ALC courses (1 core course, 2 electives) to fulfill the 4 credits
- Receive a "B" or above for any ALC course and an "S" for internships

ALP CERTIFICATE MEETINGS: 3-4 per semester

Each semester, there will be training sessions, meetings, and events specifically for the ALP Certificate cohort. These required activities will be outlined at the beginning of the semester. Some meetings will include pre- or post-event activities or assignments to complete.

SPECIAL EVENT: 1 per semester

Students are required to attend 1 special event of their choosing each semester and provide a short reflection. These sessions are to assist students in gaining insight into their career goals. These could be local presentations or online offerings such as podcasts or webinars, but must be a minimum of 30 minutes. Content should incorporate both music/arts topics AND at least one the following topics: careers, arts management, entrepreneurship, leadership, innovative ensembles, technology, wellness, community engagement, and/or DEI training. Concerts do not count. This event must be outside of an ML/ALC course in which you're enrolled.

Applications are due each September. Undergraduates starting their junior year, masters in their first semester, and doctorates in first or third semester may apply.

Application Material	Details			
Resume	A <u>current</u> resume outlining your background, work/internships and/or leadership experience. Do NOT submit a performance resume . For assistance in developing a resume, visit our website.			
Recommendation Letter	Have a faculty member, supervisor, or mentor submit a Letter of Recommendation. This letter should NOT be about your performance abilities. Rather, it should address your work ethic, personal characteristics, academic ability, potential for leadership, and/or your potential commitment to the goals of the Arts Leadership Certificate Program.			
Essays	 Write 3 short essays (1 page each). These are designed to give us a detailed view of your ambitions, and what you hope to get out of the program. Describe your career ambitions. What experience or knowledge do you hope to get out of the certificate program in order to help you achieve these career goals? Be specific. Describe any activities or projects in which you have been involved that demonstrated initiative or leadership (i.e. community engagement, ensemble organization, student organizations). What are some of the organizations for which you would like to intern? Describe 3 things you would hope to learn from your internship experience.
